Repeaters

The PAARC operates three 2-meter repeaters, which are open for all amateurs with 2-meter privileges. The 146.250 (input)/146.850 (output) repeater is located in Glasford. The repeater uses a 156.7 Hz output tone for CTCSS squelch control.

The 147.675 (input)/147.075 (output) repeater is located in Groveland. This repeater is used for the Sunday night net. This repeater uses a 156.7 Hz input tone for CTCSS squelch control.

The W9PIA D-Star 144.505 (input)/145.105 (output) repeater is located in Groveland.

Tom W8NWG made a motion to approve the meeting minutes from July, which was seconded by Mark W9WGN. The motion was approved.

Neil KC8FYI presented the Financial Report. Mark W9WGN made a motion to approve the report. Tom W8NWG seconded the motion. The motion was approved.

Communications: A letter was received from the attorney of Allen Lurie, W9KCB, SK. The club will receive \$1000 from the estate of Al Lurie.

Programs: The August meeting is planned to be a picnic, possibly on Saturday, August 11, at Detweiler Park. The September meeting will be the final preparations for SuperFest. In October Matt Behnke KD9ERS will present regarding FT-8. November will bring Dave Lucas AB9DL to the podium regarding igates and Rich Holtman KD9ANU talking about Winlink.

2019 Officers: We need to identify the officer candidates for 2019, so the slate can be presented at the October meeting, in preparation for voting in November.

Repeater Updates: The new air conditioner in the Moyer radio room works well. Additionally, the radio cabinet is being left open for good circulation. The D-Star VHF is running fine, while the UHF is down. A site visit is coming up on Sunday, August 5th.

Boy Scouts Jamboree On-the-Air/On-the-Internet: We have been asked by Kevin Stearns, a local scout leader, to participate with this event in mid-October. Board members had many thoughts and questions regarding what we might do. Dave AB9DL will follow-up to better understand what the scouts want.

Potential Constitution Changes: Discussed some potential changes. The process is to draw up the desired changes, publish once, have two readings,

and then vote; potentially at the November meeting.

Club Membership Roster: Discussed assigning each member a Membership Number beginning in 2019, and providing a Membership Card.

SuperFest: Deb KA4DEB reported that envelope stuffing to mail out tickets would follow tonight's meeting.

Neil KC8FYI made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Steve KD9AER seconded the motion. The motion was approved, and the meeting adjourned at 8:33 pm.

Club Log's **DXCC Most Wanted** entities list has been updated as of August 28. The list includes 340 entities, and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK), or North Korea, is the #1 mostwanted DXCC entity, as it has been for quite a few years.

The other top ten most-wanted entities, listed in descending order, are: 3Y/B Bouvet Island; FT5/W Crozet Island; BS7H Scarborough Reef; CE0X San Felix Islands; BV9P Pratas Island; KH7K Kure Island; KH3 Johnston Island; VK0M Macquarie Island, and FT5/X Kerguelen Island.

Islands on the Air Seeking Proposed Additions to List of Valid Island Groups

The Island on the Air (**IOTA**) program is reviewing its list of valid island groups, as it typically does every 5 years.

"This time, IOTA management has decided to bring forward the review to give a chance for any new groups announced to be activated in 2019, the target year," said Roger Balister, G3KMA, in an August 31 announcement. He continued, "The review process is scheduled to start with an announcement of some additions at this year's [Radio Society of Great Britain] Convention, and may possibly finish with a top-up at next year's Friedrichshafen HAM Radio event."

Balister told IOTA enthusiasts that he anticipates only five to ten new groups to be proposed, adding that additions to the Europe list are unlikely because the continent "is already generously covered."

Only proposals that meet the criteria at Sections B and C of the **IOTA Programme Structure** chapter (2018 *Directory*) will be

considered. **Submit** proposals for consideration to Balister by October 1, with a *brief* justification in terms of the program criteria. — *Thanks to Roger Balister, G3KMA, via IOTA*

Three Towers of San Marino Special Activity Announced

The Amateur Radio Association of the Republic of San Marino (ARRSM) has announced a special activity from the Three Towers of San Marino, September 15 – 16 (UTC, 24 hours). A group of towers located on the three peaks of Monte Titano, they are depicted on both the national flag and coat of arms.

The event will take place in conjunction with a civil protection exercise. The standard Three Towers Award is issued to a station submitting proof of contact with all the three towers on at least two bands; the honor roll award requires confirmation of contacts with all three towers on three bands.

Stations will be active on 10, 15, 20, and 40 meters (modes not available). Call signs will be T71A (Guaita), T71B (Cesta), and T71C (Montale). All three towers have historic and architectural significance and are UNESCO World Heritage sites.

Request QSLs via T70A or via the bureau. Submit award requests directly, including \$15, to PO Box 77, 47890 Republic of San Marino (via Italy).

AREA FCC EXAMS

Morton:

FCC Amateur Radio Exams are held at the Morton Public Library, 315 West Pershing at 12:00 noon the third Saturday of even numbered months or as noted: Feb 17, Apr 21, June 16, Aug 18, Oct 20 and Dec 15. If no one is there at that time the examiners will leave as they are all volunteers. Walk-ins are welcome. Please bring your original Radio License (if any) and a copy, and the original and a copy of any of any Certificate of Completion (CSCE) not already acted upon by the FCC. Copies are needed to send with your license application. Fee for 2018 is \$15.00. You will also need identification such as a Driver's License, and a Social Security Number. Bloomington:

The schedule for W5YI-VEC Amateur Radio testing dates for 2018 are: 1/27 9:00-11:00am, 3/24 1:00-3:00pm, 5/26 1:00-3:00pm. Testing is held at the Bloomington Public Library Community Room located at the intersection of E. Olive St. and S. East St. Entrance is off S. East St. People should contact Keith a week prior to the test for date and location. Testing begins at 1:00pm. Bring two forms of identification. Note on testing – A Social Security number is now required for all FCC exams.
